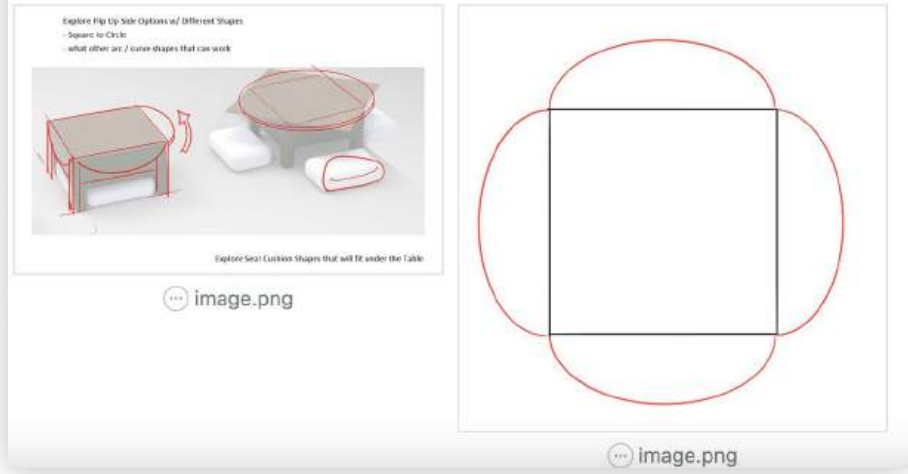


coffee table —————> 4 desks and 4 cushions



Cushion does not fit

- Explore Flip Up Existing Furniture Hardware options
- Consider curved / arc ends so the user is not sitting at a corner when open
- Other shapes besides a perfect circle could add interest to the aesthetic
- Explore the scale of the folded down and up coffee table to get sizing right that good for small space living and when entertaining guests or need a larger size
- x4 Cushion shapes need to work when stowed.
- If 4 cushions don't work, 2 could be an option.



Rounded corners



- We have not seen coffee table versions yet of flip up-side surfaces. Please explore and iterate new versions.
- The coffee table with cushions stacked may require the cushions to be scaled down so it's easier to remove for sitting on the floor.
- The new bench with flip over design to become chairs is very interesting. Keep these ideas for showcasing but we are not focusing on seating in our department or are experts in this field.

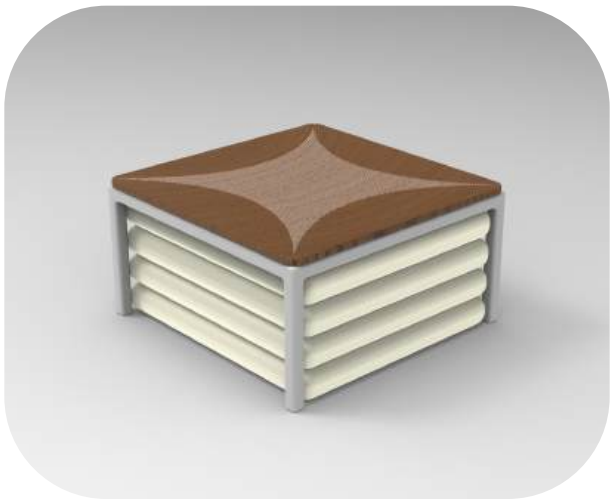
- The Coffee Table may be less functional with the top being carved as you have shown. Consider consumers using this. Drinks may get knocked over too easily on the curved elevated edges. However, it is an interesting detail but not something easily manufactured with laminated panels.
- Can we see in rendering or 3D print out a version of the Coffee Table with the sides folding down (covering some of the cushions).
- Scale down the cushions so the slide out easily between the legs.

Coffee Table / Bench

- As mentioned before - this is a very theoretical design idea, but functionally it would be hard to get enough support in the middle when used as a coffee table. Still, I like this idea a lot and there is probably a way to add some gusset supports.

For this project - Dorel will focus more on the Coffee Table with Cushions.

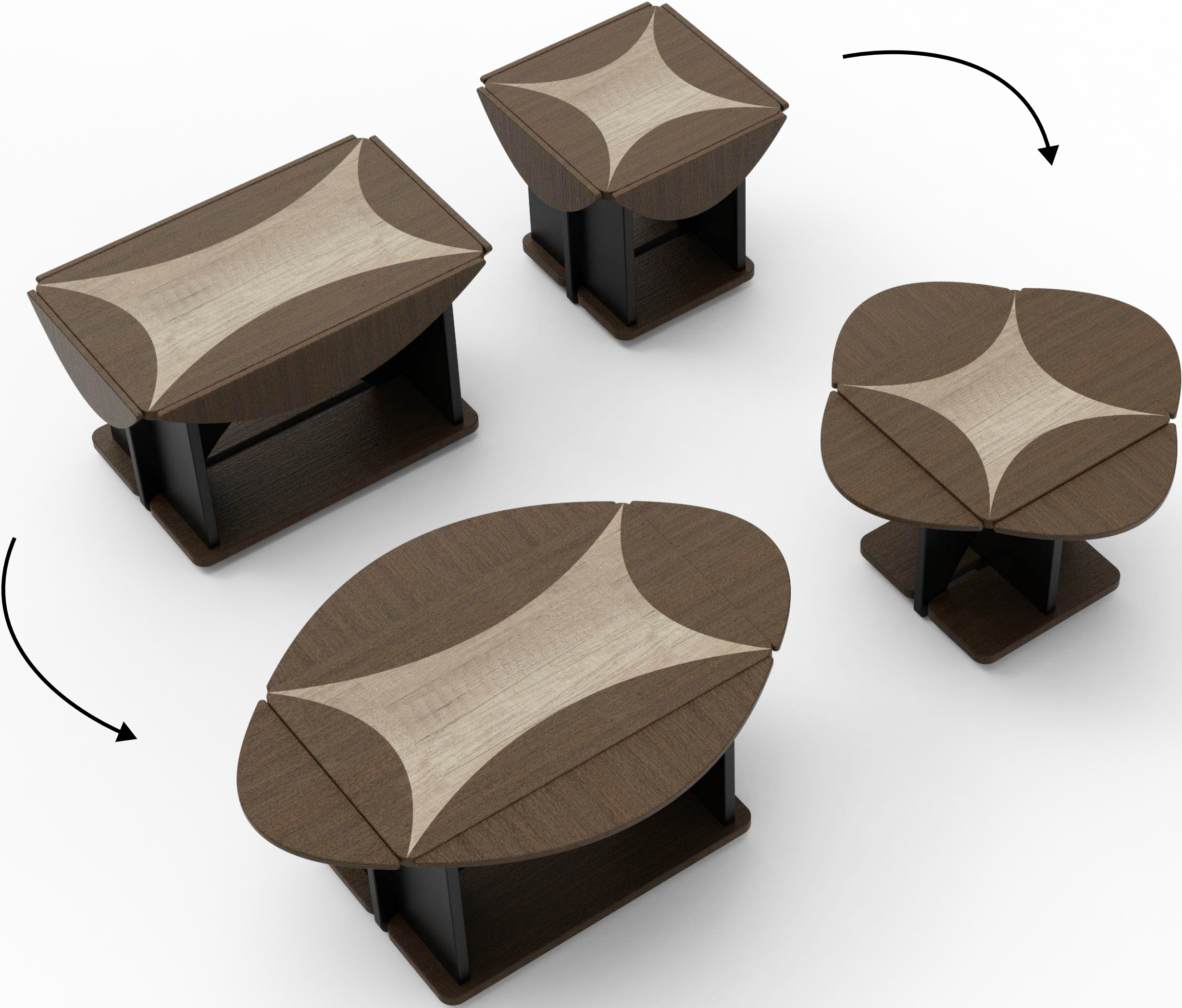

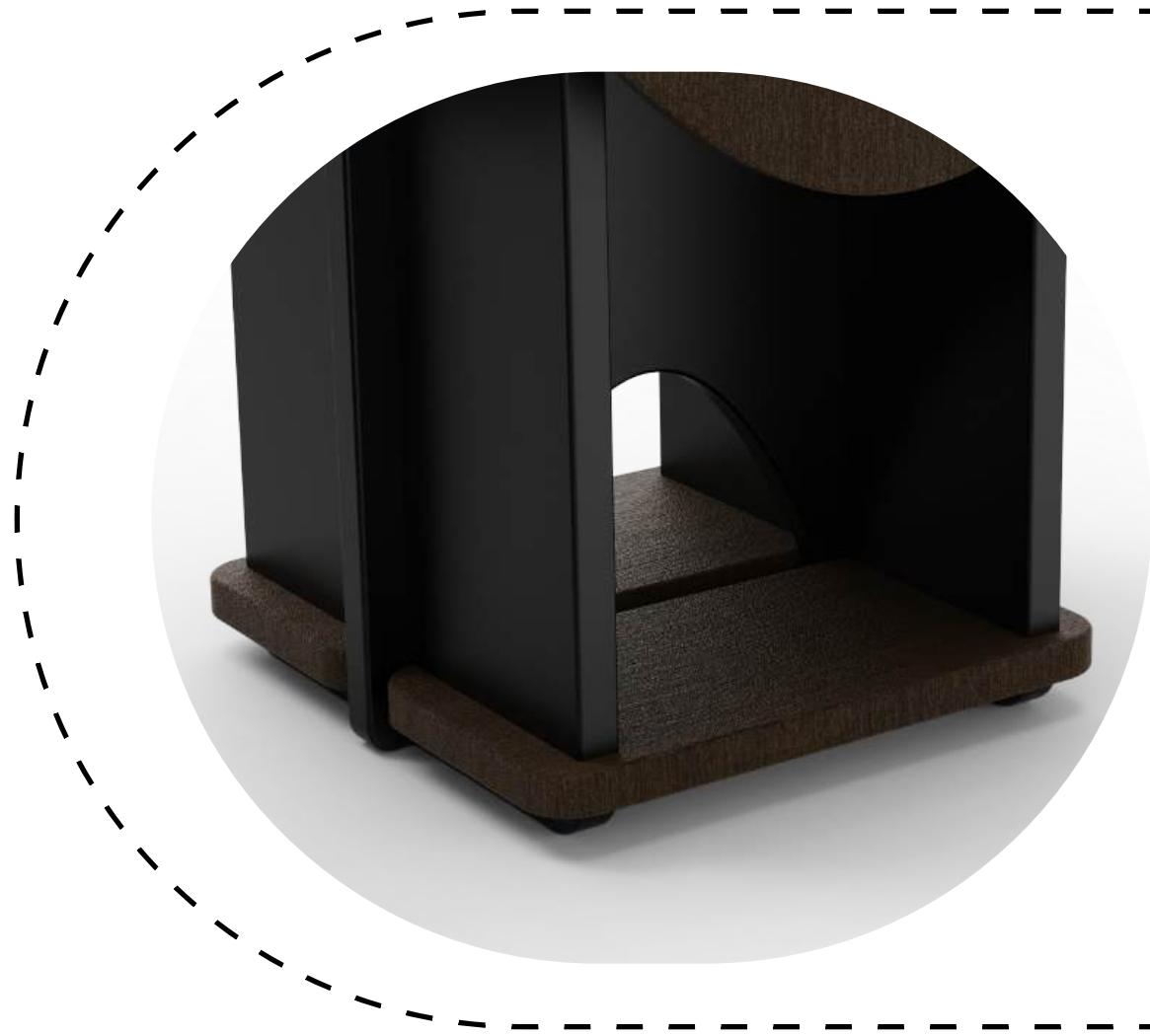




Variety of table surface sizes

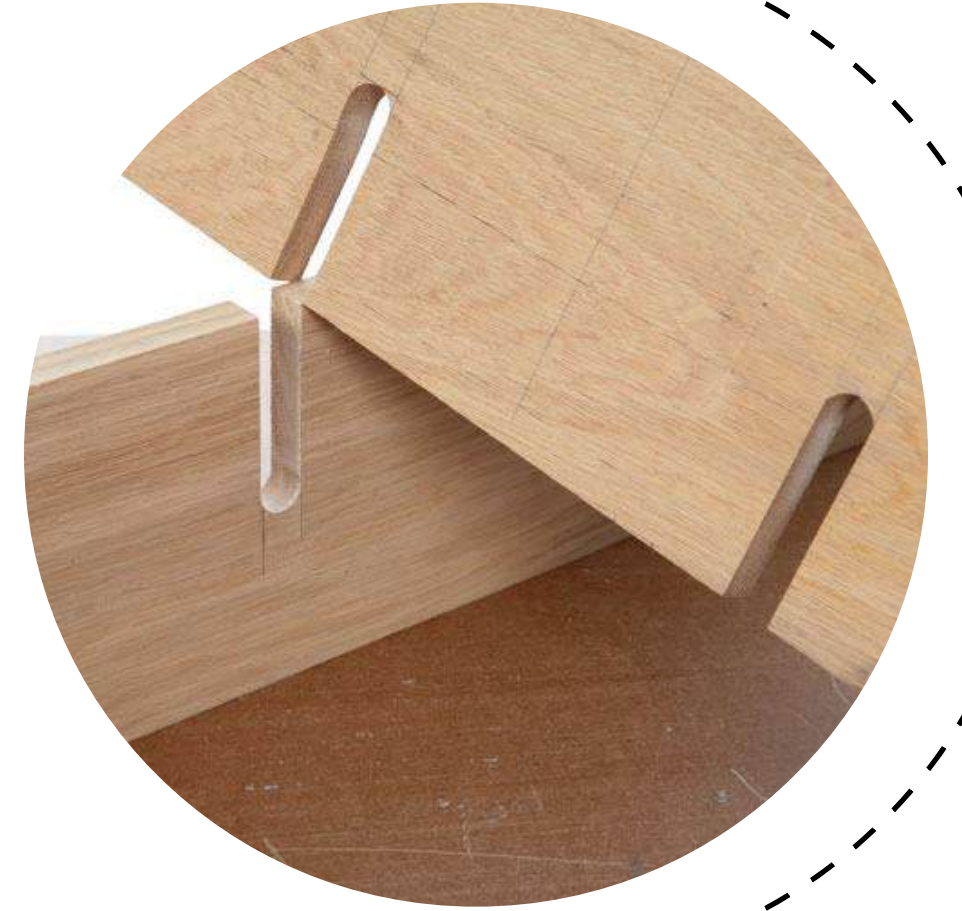

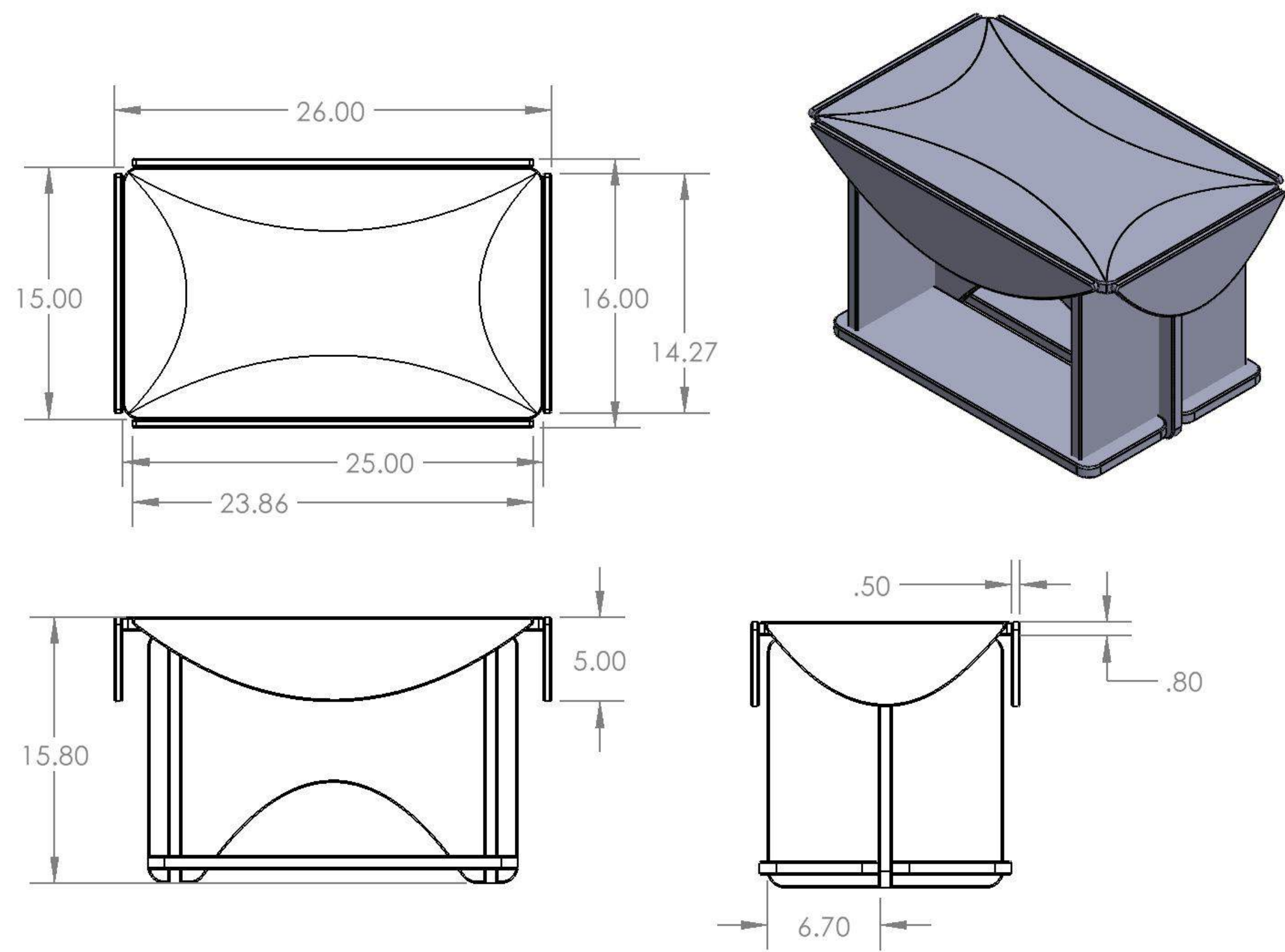
